

# Case Management for Long-Term Services & Supports (CM-LTSS) A Tool for Driving Accountability in LTSS

States are raising the bar to hold community-based organizations accountable for effectively coordinating and managing care for this vulnerable population.

## **Program Overview:**

NCQA CM-LTSS provides a framework for organizations to deliver efficient, effective and person-centered care. Standards cover a broad range of crucial areas, including:

- Use of up-to-data evidence and professional standards.
- Assessment process.
- Measurement and quality improvement.
- Staffing, training and verification.
- Person-centered care planning and monitoring.
- Rights and responsibilities.
- Care transitions.
- Delegation.

Eligible Organizations include: Area Agencies on Aging, Centers for Independent Living, care management organizations, home & community based organizations and MLTSS-only plans.
